Suggested Worship Order

May 17, 2020

(The activities and order are up to you!)

Open with a simple prayer of thanksgiving for daily divine mercies, acknowledging God's mighty faithfulness, asking for His forgiveness and for His blessing as you gather.

Read a passage of Scripture. Consider Psalm 24.

Sing a familiar hymn or song. Today you are invited to listen to or sing along with the musicians.

Watch or listen to the preaching. Here is an outline:

"The Transfiguration"

Luke 9:27-36

- I. Behold! The Glory of Christ as Supernaturally Unveiled in Exalted Majesty, vv. 28-29.
 - A. The Description of His Glory.
 - B. The Character of His Glory.
- II. Behold! The Glory of Christ as the Supreme Fulfillment and the Superior Focus, vv. 30
 - A. The Supreme Fulfillment.
 - B. The Superior Focus.
- III. Behold! The Glory of Christ in the Great Departure He Will Accomplish, v. 31.
 - A. His Striking Departure.
 - B. His Spectacular Accomplishment.
- IV. Behold! The Glory of Christ in the Divine Endorsement He Receives, vv. 34-35.
 - A. His Unique Relationship.
 - B. His Special Calling.
 - C. His Singular Authority.

Sing a song when the sermon is over. Some suggestions: *Come Behold the Wondrous Mystery,* Songbook #16; *Crown Him with Many Crowns,* Hymnbook #216; *I Will Glory in My Redeemer,* Songbook, 38.

Spend time in discussion or reflection on what you heard.

[Possible Discussion Questions]

- How would you summarize the main lesson of this passage?

The following questions are from the Puritan Thomas Manton's series of messages he gave on the Transfiguration of Christ

- Do you seriously come to Christ that you may have pardon and life?
- Do you respect the word of the gospel, receive it with reverence and delight as the voice of God's great prophet to you?
- Do you mix it with faith when you hear it so that it profits you and does you good?
- Do you receive it as the word of God?
- Does it come to you not in word only but with power as the word of God's great Mediator?
- Do you hear him on whatever the Lord chooses to speak to you?
- Do you hear him so that you prefer him to everything this world has to offer you?
- What in this account made the greatest impression on you?
- What, if anything, are you challenged to do on account of this passage? Are you following Him?

Close with prayer, thanking God for His Word, asking Him to help you to understand, hold on to, and faithfully apply what you have heard.
