

## **“Ritual vs. Reality”**

Romans 2:25-29

- 1) What was circumcision meant to signify?
  
- 2) To what does Paul tie the relative value of circumcision in verse 25? In other words, what matters where circumcision is concerned?
  
- 3) What are some “externals” that we, as Christians, can often put a misplaced or excessive confidence in terms of our relationship with God?
  
- 4) According to verses 26-27 what makes circumcision “expendable” or “non-essential”?
  
- 5) What is the significance of the language Paul uses in verse 26 where he speaks of “uncircumcision be regarded [reckoned/credited] as circumcision”? (see Rom. 3:28; 4:3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 22, 23, 24; 9:8)
  
- 6) What radical role reversal does Paul propose in verse 27? (Compare with 2:1-3)
  
- 7) What is Paul’s intention with respect to the Jews by including the theme of Gentile obedience? (see, for example, Rom. 10:19; 11:11, 14)
  
- 8) What are the “dangers” of ritualism?

- 9) How did the speaker characterize Paul's reference to the uncircumcised law-keeper in verses 26-27—as hypothetical or actual? What support was given?
- 10) According to Paul in verses 28-29 what really matters?
- 11) What is it, according to the speaker, that God has always wanted from His people? (see Deuteronomy 10:12-13) Is that what He still wants from His people? Support your answer from the Scripture.
- 12) Describe the “true circumcision” that Paul identifies in verses 28-29.
- 13) What Old Testament promises does this reality fulfill? (see Dt. 30:6; Ezek. 36:25-27; Jer. 31:31-34)
- 14) Paul does not specifically identify who is the “true Jew” in these verses, i.e., those who have receive the “true circumcision.” Who are they?
- 15) What is the ultimate significance of Paul's reference to “his praise is not from men, but from God”? (see Romans 2:7, 10, 16; 1 Cor. 4:5; 1 Pt. 7)
- 16) How does all that Paul asserts in this section (vv. 25-29) reconcile with what he will soon say in Romans 3:20 that “by works of the Law no flesh shall be justified”?

17) What was the simple cowboy's point when he said, "You ain't got it, 'til you got it inside"?
